The RE Coordinator reports to and supports the minister and works collaboratively with volunteers of all ages to co-create Religious Education programming for children and youth. Optimally, work hours include a presence at least two Sunday services per month, as this position calls for interaction with young people and coordination of adult volunteers. Respect for young people, working knowledge of child development, and ability to communicate effectively are important.

The position is FLSA Exempt: 5-7 hours per week. Compensation will be determined according to UUA Fair Compensation guidelines.

- Recruit, train, and supervise volunteer teachers and group leaders.
- Teach approximately two Religious Education classes per month, to supplement teaching by volunteers.
- Oversee supplies and request needed supplies and materials.
- Collaborate with the minister and volunteers to support the full participation of children and youth in the FMUU community.

- One to two years of experience with young people (children and/or youth) in a professional environment.
- One year of experience and/or study in child development, religion, and/or education.
- Good communication skills, collaborative, with a positive demeanor and demonstrated cultural competency.
- An appreciation of UU values and high reliability.
- Demonstrated interpersonal skills with ability to establish good working relationships with a wide range of people of varying interests and abilities.
